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This year's colloquium will be devoted to the music of the turn of the century around 1900. Today the music of this period is associated with a series of changes in style corresponding to changes in social context. Many of the composers of the period invoke new parameters, in which the laws of classical form and harmony are weakened, even though they do not abandon continuity with Classical and Romantic aesthetics, nor with many of the aims of the Sezession and the Fin de siècle.

We welcome submissions on the disintegration of traditional aesthetic values and the cross-fertilization of musical styles and genres, and on the oppositions between so-called trivial and light music ("U-Musik"), serious music ("E-Musik") and functional music ("F-Musik").

Expected length of contributions is only 20 minutes. Contributions can be only in the German and English languages. Organizers reserve the right to decide which contributions will be listed in the conference's final program. Conference organizers will provide accommodation in Brno for active participants. The organizers will not pay travel expenses.

The 45<sup>th</sup> International Musicological Colloquium will take place like every year as part of the Brno International Music Festival.
